Sisters and brothers in Christ Jesus at Grace Mennonite Church in the name of our Lord and Savior, greetings!

As we move through this season of Lent, it's time to start looking ahead to Holy Week. Holy Week is the week between Palm Sunday and Easter. Special days include Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday.

This year we will once again be hosting a Maundy Thursday evening service in the Fellowship Hall at Grace. "Maundy" has its Latin root in the word for "mandate" or "commandment." Maundy Thursday is the day in Christian tradition when we commemorate Jesus' last supper with his disciples before his betrayal and death. What we sometimes fail to notice in the Gospel accounts of the Last Supper is that Jesus, a Jewish Rabbi, is celebrating the Jewish festival of *Passover* with his disciples. That's right; the first Last Supper is in fact a Passover Seder meal! If we read carefully, we discover that the Gospel accounts of the Last Supper make this connection clear. The connections between the Passover – a festival commemorating God's liberating the Israelites from slavery in Egypt, or the Exodus – and Jesus' own death and resurrection are many and rich in meaning.

My favorite Maundy Thursday celebrations have always woven together the significance of Israel's Exodus and Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples. This year's Maundy Thursday dinner at Grace will be similar to a service I grew up with at my home church in Harrisonburg, VA. Singles, couples, and families with children of all ages are encouraged to attend. Together we read a liturgy based on the Jewish Seder meal. This first part of the service guides us through an exploration of the symbolic meaning of some of the foods of a traditional Seder meal. Children have an important part in this service; theirs is the role of asking questions, prompting a recital of the history of God's saving acts from parents and adult friends. At the mid-point of the service we pause for a simple meal of soup and bread. Afterword we carry on with the account of the Last Supper from the Gospel of John.

In John's Gospel, Jesus gives his disciples a "new commandment," or "mandate" (hence, Maundy Thursday) that they love on another as he has given them an example to do. John also gives an account of Jesus washing his disciples' feet as an example of this love. It is for this reason that some Christian traditions practice foot-washing on Maundy Thursday. Our service at Grace will not include foot-washing this year, but we will have a hand-washing ritual as a remembrance of the poignant moment shared between Jesus and his disciples. Our Maundy Thursday service will culminate in communion shared by all baptized believers present. This, again, is an opportunity for the children present to witness these things in anticipation of one day participating as a baptized adult believer.

Our Maundy Thursday service will begin at 6:00 PM on Thursday, April 19. I hope to see you there!

Community Good Friday worship service will be held at the Missionary Church in Pandora on Friday, April 19 at 7:00 pm. Mark your calendar and plan to attend!



HAPPENINGS IN AND AROUND GRACE......BY SHIRLEY SOMMER

<u>Sunday, March 3<sup>rd</sup></u> – This is the Sunday before **Ash Wednesday**, the start of **Lent**. Also, the season or time of the Christian Church year from "**Epiphany**" feast day to Mardi Gras. Guest speaker was **Rudi Kauffman**, a member of our church and a former professor at Bluffton University. His sermon title was "Who is Epiphaning? The meaning I found from different dictionaries stated: a great revelation that usually changes you in some way. Scripture was Luke 9:28-43. The main line from the scripture, I felt, was when a voice from a cloud spoke to the disciples saying, "This is my **Son**, listen to him." The little children's choir, 10 of them, sang a song by **Bryan Moyer Suderman** titled, "God's love is for everyone." As always, they did a very nice job and were easy to understand. Ash Wednesday, March 6<sup>th</sup> – A group of Bluffton area pastors offered "Ashes to Go", a new approach to centuries old Christian tradition. It was done between 7 a.m. – 9 a.m. on the corner of Main and Cherry St, across from the Coffee Shop in Bluffton. Pedestrians as well as drivers and passengers were invited. It was directed by the Presbyterian pastor, Rev. Karol Farris.

<u>Sunday, March 10<sup>th</sup></u> – Sunday bulletins are printed on purple paper – color of **Lent.** First Sunday of **Lent** with the sermon title, "**God's Hand Delivers**" by **Pastor Matthew.** Scripture was Luke 4:1-13. It was the story of the temptation of **Jesus.** As you remember he was in the desert for 40 days and the devil tried tempting him in different ways. Finally the devil gave up and left. Our Communion table at church has different changes unfold on it. This Sunday a Bible was placed in a basket instead of bread. A reminder we hunger for spiritual food and don't live by bread alone. **Pastor** left us with a question, "Have you started a new thing for **Lent?** If so, what was it like?"

Micah Ryan Kauffman, son of Ross and Anna and brother to his sister, Nora, was dedicated by Pastor Matthew. God's blessing to the family.

<u>Sunday, March 17<sup>th</sup></u> – Second Sunday of **Lent**, with the sermon title, "**God our Shelter.**" Scripture was Luke 13:31-35. **Pastor Matthew** stated that we get **God's** trust and belief as our shelter. The **Pharisees** told him to leave because **Herod** wants to kill him. He replied, "No, I'm getting rid of demons and heal people. **Jesus** mentioned he would like to protect us like a hen does her chicks under her wings. The **Lord's** shelter is <u>trust and belief.</u> On the Communion table was the warm light of the **Christ candle** as an invitation to receive the warmth of **God's** abundant love.

**Noon** – a potluck meal was enjoyed by a crowd and welcomed the University students for the last time this school year to join us. A large assortment of food as always was there.

**4 p.m.** at Yoder's Hall, a variety show was co-organized by **Dr. Crystal Battle**, professor of music at the University and **Wendy Chappell-Dick**, put the words to different songs at the time of I<sup>st</sup> World War Era. The show was titled, "**Songs of Conscience and Peace Music of the Great War Era.**" It was a <u>very powerful and emotional</u> music program with readings, and songs expressing the feelings and reasons why people during this time did what they did. **Carolyn McDaniel**, led the choir; **Brian Tempe** and **Meghan Gibson-Martin** sang solos and were in the choir too. (Just sharing this now, I can again hear some of the songs and see some of the parts acted out. Tears just would appear out of no where!)

<u>Sunday, March 24<sup>th</sup></u> – The third Sunday of Lent. Sermon title was "Lifewater." Scripture was Luke 13:1-19. (Keith and I weren't at church today, so I can't really share anything about the sermon or what happened in church today.) But the reading from the **Bible** was the parable of the fig tree that didn't have any fruit for three years and was spared for one more year to see if any fruit would come with special care. If not, it would then be cut down.

In the announcements, **Pastor Matthew** mentioned he was starting a membership class for those interested in baptism or membership at Grace.

The membership class will be 10 sessions long and meet during the Sunday School hour. If interested, contact **Pastor Matthew** at his office.

**4:30 p.m.** MYF held an Auction to help pay for their trip to Conference this summer. About 80 items or so (I was told) were donated and received about \$6000 or less from the sale.
