#### Reflections

Today I've been thinking back over my first year of service in ministry here at Grace. I intentionally approached that year as a year of "yes." And may the Grace of God be with us all.






#### CDC Annual Meeting June 21—June 23, 2018

<u>Sunday, April 29<sup>th</sup> – Rudi Kauffman</u> was our speaker for the day. Scripture lesson was I John 4:7-21. In the reading, **John** stated that "if we love one another, **God** lives in us and his love is made complete in us." At the end of the chapter, **John** said, "whoever loves **God** must also love his brother." The hymns that were sung went right along with the scripture verses. Before Sharing Time, recognition of University students were shared, stating their names and plans for the next year after graduation. We had three seniors present that came to church on Sunday. At noon, a potluck was given in their honor and enjoyed by them and congregation members. As usual, a nice variety and always so tasty.

<u>Friday thru Snday, May 4<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup></u> was Bluffton University's graduation and May Day activities for students, alumni and friends to enjoy. There was a play, "title of show", at Yoder's on Friday and Saturday night (**Meghan Gibson, Sarah Sprunger's** daughter was in it). Saturday morning there was the usual run, reunions, recitals, afternoon lunch and the traditional "**May Pole**" dance followed by the introduction of the graduates. It was a wonderful day on Saturday for being outside (weather wise) and I heard that things seem to go smooth.

**Sunday, May 6<sup>th</sup>** - **Pastor Matthew** continued the sermon series this 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday after Easter titled "Love." Sermon was "He is risen! Now What?" Scripture was I John 5:1-6. **Pastor** asked us at the beginning, "How do we know you love **Jesus?**' The answer is "If you believe in **Jesus** and love one another" you have the answer. Divine love has the power to transform the world. Also was mentioned that Faith is love; love is action; action leads to transformation and transformation is VICTORY! The song following the sermon was "I Will Call Upon the **Lord."** The words really went right along with the message and "topped" the message off, **I** felt.

<u>Sunday, May 13<sup>th</sup></u>, **Mother's Day!** Sermon topic was "Ascension of our **Lord."** Scripture reading came from Acts I: I-II. The verses tell us about **Jesus** beginning to teach until the day he was taken up to heaven. After giving instructions through the **Holy Spirit** to the apostles he had chosen. **Jesus** appeared to them during the 40 days and spoke about the **Kingdom of God** to them. He told them to stay in Jerusalem and they'll receive power when the **Holy Spirit** comes. After telling them this, he was taken up in a cloud from them and will come back the same way. (This book in the **Bible**, Acts, is known as Acts of the Apostles.) **Pastor Matthew** left us with the question, "What does this mean for us?" He suggested peace building at home, work, with friends, community and country. Ask **God** to help us fix it and be a witness for healing and hope. At offering time, **Jodi and Jenny** played a special duet number in honor of their mother, **Mildred Lugibihl**. As usual, it was beautiful!!

After the service as we were leaving, Mothers received a flower which was to honor them for Mother's Day. A thank you to whoever was responsible for such a nice thing to do.

<u>Sunday, May 20<sup>th</sup>, Pentecost Sunday – Wow!!</u> The sanctuary was decorated with colors of red and yellow---balloons, red/yellow streamers in the choir loft area, and on Communion table was decorated in those colors with a white dove hanging on a red cloth draped over the brass Cross. Very, very, effective!!



To open our service, the Adult Choir and Grace Notes Choir sang together the song, "Sing dem Herrn" by Praetorious. English words are —"Sing to the **Lord**, Alleluia. All who love **Him** praise **His** name. Sing with tambourine and harp." Then for the scripture reading, there was a Worship Drama from Acts 2:1-21. **Pastor Matthew** was the reader and it was acted out by eight people from the congregation: **Ivan Friesen, Meg Schroeder, Richard Geiger, Brian Timpe, Sue Habegger, Carolyn McDaniel and Ted Cunningham.** The verses stated how the followers waited for the **Holy Spirit** to arrive at Pentecost all in one place. A violent wind came from heaven and they saw tongues (looked like) of fire on their heads. Everyone present heard them speak in different languages and people thought they had too much wine to drink. **Peter** then told them they are o.k. He explained how they were to go out and prophesy to others. This is how the <u>first church got started!</u>

~The Cherubic Choir (11) children sang "There were twelve disciples" and they were accompanied by Josh Sprunger on guitar. The next song was "Can a growing child like me," accompanied by Liam Dorman & his mother, Denise, played a duet on the piano for the children to sing. Last, the choir members acted out and spoke the scripture, Romans 8:38-39.

**Pastor Matthew** then spoke about "Breath" and how very important this is to each of us and everything thing that **God** created. He continued to say, that when one has a crisis, **God's spirit** is on the move with the breath of Pentecost. **God** breathes new life in all of his creation! Service longer than usual, but I feel that the drama will help us remember the scripture, children performing was **GREAT** because we don't usually have a Children's Program anymore and those involved won't forget what they did today for sometime. The songs again that we sang had a great message in them. What a service, and I know I'll remember it for quite sometime.
